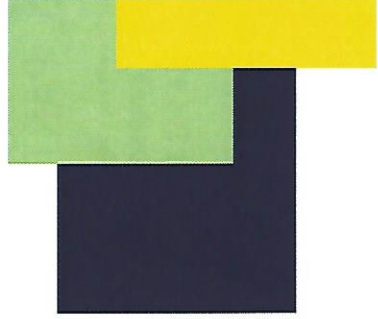

SBIRT Program

Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) is an evidence-based program that helps to identify and increase positive health behaviors for students at-risk for substance use and/or mental health issues.



SBIRT Goal

Improve the overall health and well-being of youth in Morgan County

SBIRT Objectives

- ◆ Improve youth access to programs for substance use and/or mental health intervention and treatment
- ◆ Increase youth awareness of positive and prevention programs available in the community.
- ◆ Increase opportunities for youth to learn about their health statuses' on a regular basis
